The Department of Economics is excited to release its fifth annual newsletter.

A few of the highlights include awards and recognition for our faculty members' research and teaching, inclusion of one of our graduate students in a competitive international conference, exciting Ph.D. job placements, a large external grant to facilitate research on labor markets here in our own backyard in the Inland Empire and across the state, the creation of a new degree program, and the retirement of two of our most revered faculty members.

Our new graduate degree program, a Master of Arts in Applied Economics, is a professional degree that allows students to specialize in an area of their choosing, including Business and Finance, Econometrics and Data Analysis, and Economics and Public Policy. Graduates will be equipped with analytical and quantitative skills to pursue careers as professional economists in the private and public sectors. We plan to welcome the inaugural class in Fall 2024. We are also in the process of creating a 4+1 option to make it even easier for our own undergraduates to complete the M.A. We are counting on our student, parent, faculty, staff, and alumni community to help us identify great candidates for the program.

A bittersweet part of university life is that faculty come and go. We were honored, yet sad, to say goodbye to Taradas Bandyopadhyay and Aman Ullah, who both retired in 2022. Bandyopadhyay and Ullah had the longest tenure in the department. Ullah became a Distinguished Professor of the Graduate Division and was kind enough to teach a graduate class this year.

The cycle of (professional) life has touched me as well. After six years, I will be stepping down as Chair in July. This has been a rewarding career experience. It has been an honor to contribute my energy to making the department and university a better place. I look forward to having more time for my research, including an exciting new project on climate change and drought in Brazil.

Establishment of UCR Labor and Community Center

Principal Investigator Dr. Ellen Reese (Sociology) and co-Principal Investigators Drs. Marissa Brooks (Political Science), Richard Rodriguez (Media Cultural Studies), and our very own **Michael Bates** were awarded \$500,000 per year to establish the UCR Labor and Community Center. Dr. Bates was intricately involved in grant writing, budgeting, negotiating with the administration, and meeting with local leaders to build community support. This center brings together workers, students, faculty, labor and community organizations, and policymakers to address critical issues in the Inland Empire and California. In Summer 2023, the center will launch a scholarship as well as an internship program. Reports on the Inland Empire labor market will also be available starting in the summer. In the coming months, the center will recruit an Executive Director and Research Director.
